Open-Top Sightseeing Bus Tour

The Big Bus Tours offers a hop-on, hop-off sightseeing service in Hong Kong. The open-top double-decker buses stop at various key locations throughout the city, allowing passengers to hop off for exploration and hop back on to continue the journey. Along the way, recorded commentary are available in nine languages, provides insights into the history and culture of Hong Kong.



The tours feature three Hop-on Hop-off daytime routes and a Panoramic Night Tour:

- Hong Kong Island Tour (Red Route): Explore iconic attractions, from skyscrapers to temples.

Lantau Culture and Heritage Insights

Lantau Island, Hong Kong's largest outlying island, is famous for its scenic countryside and the giant Buddha statue. Visitors can explore Ngong Ping Village with attractions like Motion 360, enjoy the Po Lin Monastery, and climb 268 steps to see the world's tallest seated outdoor bronze Buddha. Notable sites include the Wisdom Path with inscribed wooden steles.

Tai O Fishing Village

Tai O, a charming fishing village on Lantau Island, features stilt houses over tidal waters and interconnected wooden bridges, creating a picturesque setting for visitors. Visitors can explore Hong Kong's fishing heritage and enjoy local seafood. One of the best ways to explore Tai O is by taking a boat tour, allowing visitors to glide past the stilt houses and wooden pathways. Tickets for these boat rides can be purchased from vendors situated along the waterfront.

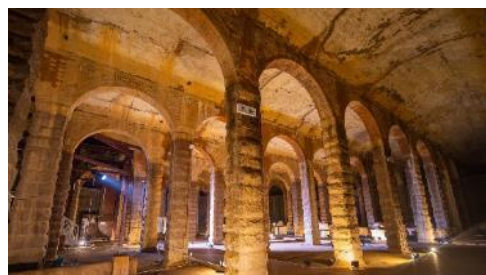
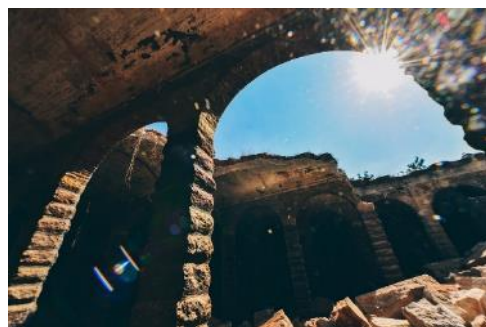

Ex-Sham Shui Po Service Reservoir

The Ex-Sham Shui Po Service Reservoir, rediscovered in 2020, illustrates Hong Kong's water supply history with its European-style granite piers and red brick arches reflecting Roman influences. Built in 1904 as part of the Kowloon Waterworks Gravitation Scheme, it served Kowloon districts until 1970, with a storage capacity of 9,900 cubic metres. Recognized as a Grade 1 historic structure, it reopens for visits last year. Its circular layout combines aesthetics with functionality, highlighting its historical and architectural significance.

Kowloon City



Kowloon City, situated in the eastern part of the Kowloon Peninsula, is one of the most culturally rich areas in Hong Kong. This neighborhood has a history that stretches back centuries, with landmarks originating from the 13th century. The former Kowloon Walled City, once known for its challenging living conditions, has now been transformed into quaint coffee shops.



The sets of the Hong Kong Film Awards Best Picture “Twilight of the Warriors: Walled In” are now located on the original sites of the Walled City – the present Kowloon Walled City Park.

WestK



WestK is one of the largest and most ambitious cultural hubs in the world and Hong Kong's new cultural tourism landmark, spanning forty hectares alongside Victoria Harbour. Hosting over 1,000 exhibitions, performances, programmes, and events each year, WestK comprises a mix of landmark arts and cultural facilities, and provides a vital platform for both emerging and established artists. WestK welcomes more than ten million visitors each year, evolving as the international cultural brand of Hong Kong.

Art Park

The Art Park is the green heart of the WestK. With a rich variety of trees and green planting as well as open lawn spaces, the park provides a vibrant venue for open-air performances, exhibitions and other cultural events. The Art Park also features a growing range of facilities, including the waterfront promenade, large lawn areas, and harbourside restaurants and cafes for leisure and relaxation.

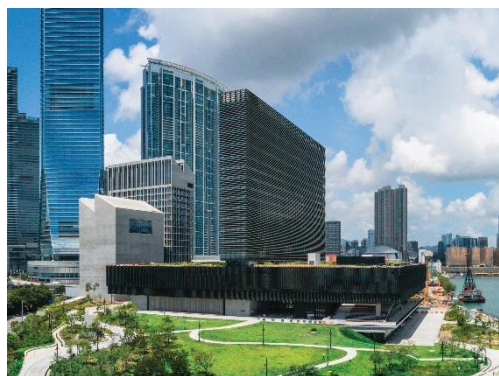

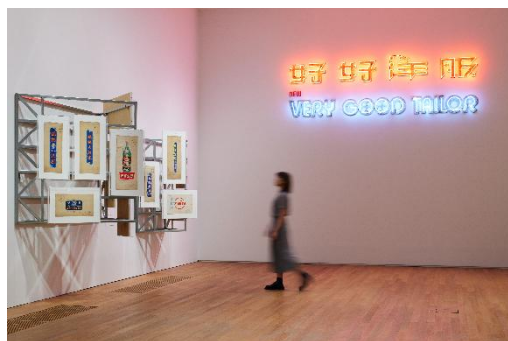

Hop from island to island to explore the geological wonders of Hong Kong up close, from pineapple bun-shaped rocks, ancient sea caves, to towering volcanic rock columns and majestic sea arches.

Hiking: High Island Geo Trail

High Island Geo Trail lies beside the beautiful High Island Reservoir — created after two large dams blocked a narrow channel between High Island and the eastern side of Sai Kung Peninsula. The area, situated within Hong Kong UNESCO Global Geopark, is home to breathtaking rock landscapes of international geological importance formed when a supervolcano erupted 140 million years ago. Signs dotting the leisurely trail offer insights into Instagram-friendly delights including towering cliff faces lined with hexagonal rock columns, mysterious caves and sea stacks and — atop Biu Tsim Kok hill — stunning coastal scenery, such as picturesque Long Ke Wan.
